

JANE NELSON

Jane Nelson is Director of the Corporate Social Responsibility Initiative at the Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, and a nonresident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution. She was a director and then senior advisor at the Prince of Wales International Business Leaders Forum from 1993 to 2012. She has been a senior associate with the Institute for Sustainability Leadership at Cambridge University, and an advisor to the Clinton Global Initiative leading their track on developing human capital in 2009. In 2001, she worked with the United Nations Global Compact in the office of the UN Secretary-General preparing a report for the General Assembly on cooperation between the UN and the private sector. Prior to 1993, she worked for the World Business Council for Sustainable Development in Africa, for FUNDES in Latin America, and as a Vice President at Citibank working for the bank's Financial Institutions Group in Asia, Europe and the Middle East.

Nelson serves on the boards of directors of Newmont Mining, the Abraaj Group, FSG, Chevron's Niger Delta Partnership Initiative, the ImagineNations Group, and the International Council of Toy Industries CARE foundation. She serves on advisory councils for the International Finance Corporation (IFC), Abbott, ExxonMobil, GE, APCO Worldwide, the Center for Global Development, the Initiative for Global Development, the Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Center, and the Fowler Center for Sustainable Value at Case Western Reserve University. She has previously served on boards or advisory groups for the World Environment Center, the World Economic Forum, the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition, the Global Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, SITA (now a subsidiary of Suez Environnement), British Telecom (BT), SustainAbility, Volans Social Ventures, the International Council on Mining and Metals, the UK Department for International Development, and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP).

She has co-authored five books and over 80 publications on corporate responsibility, sustainability and the role of the private sector in global development, and five of the World Economic Forum's Global Corporate Citizenship reports. Born and raised in Zimbabwe, Nelson is graduate of the University of Natal in South Africa and Oxford University in the UK. She is a former Rhodes Scholar and recipient of the Keystone Center's 2005 Leadership in Education Award.
